I have an interest in encouraging fellow Christians to explore their faith and identity, particularly as it connects with being Christian in Aotearoa/New Zealand. I am excited by the 'local' content of the EFM course in Aotearoa/ New Zealand and humbled to be asked to serve on the board of EFM. As current board chair, I decided last year it was time I took the plunge. So I am currently with the Te Awakairangi group, which meets in Lower Hutt, and soon to begin my second year. It's been a great way to refresh my studies without the stress of assignments.

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Trainers Corner

A place to find some ideas for EfM groups

Kia ora koutou. Here is a game which I use from time to time to help people get into the mind-set of thinking in metaphors. It works best when people know one another at least a bit.

THE METAPHOR GAME

Choose someone to be the Questioner and send them out of ear-shot. The group chooses someone who is in the room to be the Subject. Call the Questioner back. The Questioner now has to guess who the Subject is by asking each member of the group a question.

The questions are phrased:

"If this person was a (*category*) what sort of (*category*) would they be?" For each person they ask, the Questioner chooses a new category.

eg. "If this person was a tree what sort of tree would they be?"

- "If this person was a kitchen utensil what sort of kitchen utensil would they be?"
- "If this person was a *dog* what sort of *dog* would they be?"

"If this person was a *musical instrument* what sort of *musical instrument* would they be?"

Those who are asked are encouraged to give an intuitive answer, following their gut rather than analysing or intellectualising the answer, or basing it on what they look like.

The Questioner gets to ask each group member a question. Then, by the same sort of process - intuitively, following their gut rather than analysing or intellectualising their answer – the Questioner makes a guess as to which group member is being described metaphorically.

Rinse and repeat. And above all, have fun!
